Biggest Year Ever: Community Bank & Trust's 2025 Easter Egg Hunt and 5K Fun Run Unites LaGrange in Celebration

While the runners hit their stride, anticipation grew among the youngest attendees—kids 10 and under—who took to the field with baskets in hand and wide-eyed excitement. Bradfield also kept the kids engaged throughout the day with games and a dynamic obstacle course, keeping the energy high from start to finish.

“This isn't just about a race or an egg hunt—it's about building memories, fostering community, and showing people we care,” said Jeremy Gilpin, Chairman of Community Bankshares Inc. “When over a hundred kids are laughing with the Easter Bunny and local families are coming together with food, fun and purpose—that's community banking in action.”



Adding a heartwarming chapter to the day's events, the LaGrange Troup County Humane Society brought adoptable dogs to run in the 5K—and three lucky pups found forever homes by the time the festivities came to a close, including one dog Rico that had been at the shelter for over two years. Childhood literacy was also highlighted by the presence of the Jungle Bus. Success by Six volunteers Nicole Kennedy and Gail Gordon had a steady stream of young readers who took home over 160 books provided through this partnership with United Way and the Troup County School System.

“Watching our dogs run with families and then find their forever homes—there are no words,” said Kaley Hebert of the Humane Society. “This event gave them more than exposure. It gave them love.”

“Our partnerships with the Humane Society the United Way reflect what we're all about—**bringing people together to make a difference**,” said **Bill Stump**, Director of Community Banking at Community Bank & Trust. “To see families running with shelter dogs and then opening their homes to them—**that's the kind of impact we want to create**.
